Annexure-VII: Best Practice-1 of the college for the session 2017-18:

1. Title of the practice:

Mission for promoting Action Research and Critical Reflection among the graduate teachers effecting change in traditional teaching – learning practices.

2. Goals:

The practice set its goals to orient the graduate teachers regarding the best practices of professional excellence effecting a positive change in the traditional teaching learning processes. It is for the purpose of initiating a new dimension in teaching and learning with a pro research and self selective approach, the practice embraces a wide variety of cognitive deal with the young aspirant graduates and the working teachers at the secondary stage among the college. The practice has been carried out over the years has enabled the trainee teachers to condition teaching with the inbuilt strength and critical reflection. This is because of the mission under way the practice aims at revitalizing the goal for action taken rather than only theorizing the change.

The core objective of the mission behind the practice is to produce a bulk of competent teachers every year with the latest updates in science of teaching and behavioural psychology.

3. The context:

Since the practice design especially for enlightening the graduate teachers undergoing training courses in the neighbouring training institute amidst rural surroundings it usually gets affected by certain challenges and problems are arising out of the longitudinal effects of traditional practices in teaching learning and evaluation on both the counterpart of teacher and students.

The mindset of those involve in teaching learning has become so dormant that it becomes almost impracticable to make it come out so sharply. The mission of our practice to institute a shift from conventional mode of teaching behaviour to a pro research and self selective approach linked with critical reflection.

Another challenge that needs to be addressed for effective implementation of the practice is the forward design of curriculum where there is little chance of experimentation and reflection. The trainee teachers induced with readymade set of goals and input materials which they tend to follow blindly or without caring any course for the enquiry and investigation into the educational objectives. This leads the teachers and students grow a passive on looks and nothing else.

The conventional modes of evaluation and assessment system does also pose challenges as the excessive examination centre uses allures the teachers and students concentrate on how to manage situation to score good makes in examination.

4. The practice:

The practice involves a mission composed of the senior and selected teachers of the college under guidance of Research Committee, Nabajyoti College to plan strategy to orient the trainee teachers (primary and secondary) regarding their teaching practices and teacher research during their training schedule.

The group of expert teachers find time every week to work with the trainee teachers and ensures their participation in project works, case study doing action research on the issues and problems they encounter regularly in course of their teaching practices. The expert teachers are entrusted to provide necessary supports and guidance how to locate the problem and work in collaboration with other staff for an efficient solution and implement the findings the action.

The mission of our practice targets the areas where the school teacher have access to exercise their description play leadership role live classroom, management, curriculum transaction, time management, teaching strategies and techniques, co-curriculum activities, examination and evaluation system selection of TLM and their use etc.

The expert teachers comprising of the mission make a survey initially of the course and curriculum both theories and practicum's along with assignments in different subjects allotted and then short out what and where the teachers trainees need orientation about. After having things well managed, the experts of our staff advance to plan strategies and plan to work with them in groups of 5 to 10 learner teachers. They are worked to prepare a draft list of problems they face during their classroom transaction make a final choice from among them on which they are going to act with. Hey are also advised to formulate hypothesis of their studies and make a design how to collect information and also review related literature if any. The trainee teachers undergo investigation and collect sufficient dates and information regarding the problems and work out a virtual solution which they trying in action in real classroom setting when they back to their job.

The practice may add a unique dimension to the existing teaching practices especially in the secondary stage in our country. This will open a door to strategic shift from passive adoption to active invention. This will help teacher grow a critic from the yes boss concept. The college teachers also may enjoy their right to exercise their intellectual leadership among the teaching professional which will ensure and enhance coordination among the teachers of different stages and bridge the virtual distance between the college teachers and the school teachers.

There are however, certain problems and constraints that often stand on way to realizing the goals. The major constraint is the lack of appropriate infrastructure available in the schools. Another problem is related to the mindset of the teachers and the other stakeholders.

5. Evidence of success:

The practice on so far has achieved enormous success in terms of realizing its objectives to target a massive 100trainesss every year to orient then regarding self selection and critical reflection in course of their actual teaching practices.

Every year comes with successful pass out the targeted groups of trainee teachers enlightened with the knowledge and required skills in doing project works, case studies and research activities based on classroom problems most endemic to their respective local context. Numbers of trainees have got jobs in NAVADAYA SCHOOL across the country where they achieve success in teaching and research works.

The student teachers' who prospect to be 'creative' teachers are being trained up by own expert teachers how to deal with problems and take active for immediate solution and review critically of the findings. The massive enrolment in private schools and academies where these teachers get self employment witness the great success of own practice.

The new trend of learning by doing research has been in practice since several years back in the secondary and higher secondary schools as a result of this initiative taken y the new practice.

6. Problems encountered and resources required:

In implementing the practice, however, a great deal of efforts have been initiated and achieve success accordingly to a large extend. But despite, there have always some problems in implementing the practice in respect of money, matter and men.

The problem as the team members experience in the course of activity are recorded as follows-

- 1. Problem of monetary constraint.
- 2. Problem of support system.
- 3. Problem arising out of poor infrastructure of the school.
- 4. Problem of excessive load of subject based curriculum.
- 5. Problems of Evaluation System practices have been given less important.

These problems, however, may be resolved by positive determination and resource management. IQAC of the college have to generate a found for the purpose and also involve other institution in the mission and ensure their collaboration.

Title: Feedback on performance of the Teachers and Management of the college by the students, employees and the parents.

1. **Goal:**

This practice aims to ensure the internal quality right from the ground level at academic and administrative functioning's of the college. The teachers accountability is judged not only by the classes they engage, nor the mere six hours long stay in the college a day, but it should be ganged by the global skills of the teachers in academic, diagnostic and evaluative functioning's involving capacity to mange time table and maintain discipline. Performance of the teachers assessed by the students ensures the quality of the class teaching and help to promote proper functioning of the college especially in the field of quality education and to improve the academic environment of the college.

The chief objective of the practice is to help the teachers, employees and management of the college to self evaluate their respective roles and functioning and to bring desirable changes in behavior and approaches in addition to rectify the loopholes. This is to improve the overall environment of the college including infrastructure, support system and the administrative mechanism leading to the growth of a student friendly environment in the college campus.

This is also important from the point of view of involvement of the parents, guardians, alumni and other stakeholders who, because of this practice, have the open access into the academic and management area of the college, which ultimately brings the college closer to the community itself.

The practice set its goal to ensure transparency in administration and management and encourage participation and sharing of views of all concerned including students and the employees of the college.

2. The context:

The practice is carried out in the context of academic, administrative evaluative and management of the college. The practice however, does not confine only within the campus of the college, rather it extends to the society comprising of the parents, alumni guardians, well wishers and the other stakeholders endemic to the college family.

The practice covers a wide range of population comprising of the students and the employees of the college sharing their views and opinions on all the assessment criteria like teacher's punctuality, attendance, communicative skills report, completion of course, teaching approaches and method, use of TLM and other support aids, participation in co-curricular activities etc.

The practice adopted by the college is meant for the college family as a whole including the local community involving in various activities of the college related to academic cognitive, evaluative and administrative domain. The academic activities are to be brought under surveillance of the students and of their guardians with a view to move necessary modifications on the basis of their assessment and suggestion.

It covers the management and administrative of the college comprised of the Principal cum Secretary to the Governing body, the president of the Governing body and the members of the body including the guardian member teacher representatives and the non teaching staff members. The Governing body of the college is legally held responsible to look after A to Z of the college including academic works and the general administrative and management activities of the college and in doing so, this legal body is In constant deal with the teaching, non teaching staff and the students affairs. The employees of the college are mostly affected/influenced by the governing body, regarding the performance and approaches of the Principal is seen more authentic and credible.

Teachers' personality, their level of updation, expertise and influence over the students, teachers related with the parents and guardians do also carries significant roles on the part of the college administration.

3. The practice has been summed up in few lines of the following paragraphs:

The College IQAC has made it mandatory for each students, employees, parents and alumni's to respond to the queries high lighting the crucial points related to the performance of the teachers and management of the college. For this, IQAC work out the relevant and significant parameters of teachers performance and arrange them the proper order of graduation in ranking in mummeries or alphabetic sequence denoting the value there of. The IQAC use to prepare proper format describing all the parameters of performance/achievement of the teachers and the management.

After, the formats being ready to serve, the IQAC hold a meeting with all its members chaired by the Principal of the college to chalk out procedures to dispense the formats among the students and mechanism of evaluating their responses in time. For this IQAC organize a counseling program for communicating the students and employees and provide proper instruction as to what they should do and what should not. In due course of time, the IQAC appoints persons from among the senior teachers to have the responses of the students employees and the parents in the proper formats supplied to them for subsequent steps of assessment and evaluation.

After all the response sheets being collected, IQAC holds a meeting and provide necessary guidelines to assess the rankings done by the students against respective teachers and the employees with proper interpretations. The feedback response are recorded against certain specific criteria such knowledge, expertise, regularity and punctuality, communication with the students, maintenance of discipline, time management, course completion ability etc. which covers almost all the relevant criteria to be an efficient teachers.

The IQAC is also held responsible to communicate with the parents and alumnis of the college and assessed by them too. For this, the college authority, to maintain close touch with the community and also to be informed make necessary provision under this practice to collect their feedback report on various crucial issues related to teachers' performance and the management. For this, every year, guardians association is formed and also an alumni association is working with the college authority for the common interest of the college and the community itself. These associations are no less than a part and panel of the college and they instantly cooperate with the college authority directly and indirectly through sharing views and participating activities. IQAC prepares a distinct format for recording the feedack reports of the parents and alumni regarding the performance of the teachers and the management of the college.

4. Evidence of success:

The teachers behavior change in terms of the best performance on this part itself in the best indies of success. The teachers tend to re think of their onus and grow accountable to their professional obligations and constantly doing best in teaching learning and other allied activities for the interest of the college and students. It is because of the students' assessment, the teachers remain alert and do things right as per the rule and expense whole tie doing works for the betterment of their carrier in addition to the regular job of teaching and learning. Most frequently the teachers seem adhered to academic activities and also working for the good of the community.

Visiting learners house, inviting parents, holding meeting with guardians and alumni, sharing experiences with the children have become regular phenomena now a days In the college.

The teaching strategies adopted by the teachers have now got a new dimension as the teachers go through a change as suggested by the evaluation committee formed by the IQAC of the college. The change attitude of the teachers towards teaching learning has immensely influenced the effectiveness of classroom transaction and the students could draw benefits a lot.

The involvement of parents, guardians and alumni via the feedback report on performance of the teachers and management witnesses a massive change in the overall atmosphere of the college and the college family finds a new strength to work with more confidence and concentration.

The management of the college is not escaped from the keen surveillance of the guardians for this trend of new practice of feedback system. The administrative chief of the college seem to work not only for academic and administrative credit, he goes steps ahead to work her the betterment of the community in collaboration with the elites and all the sections of people in society. Frequent meet of guardians, alumni association, Parent Teacher Association (PTA) are the bench mark achievement of the practice adopted so far in the name of feedback report evaluation.
