2. Profile of the College

2.a. Introduction

On an auspicious day, the 16th August 1971 the foundation stone of this premier institution was laid in a rural landscape of Kalgachia in West Barpeta District with a noble aim to spread higher education in this area. The college, from its inception day has flourished rapidly in each and every parameter of scholastic and co scholastic domain including the infrastructural growth. Initially, the college was started with the Arts stream subjects in both intermediate (PU) and under graduate (UG) classes as general course, and then Honours Courses in different Subjects were opened. The science stream, however was introduced in the year 1979 and, successively, the honours courses were offered in different subjects. Recently, the college offers BA/BSc programs at UG level along with two centres of Distance and Open learning under GU-IDOL, KKHSOU which offer a multiple options of subject variety of Degree and Diploma Courses in UG and PG programmes.

The college has efficiently faced two cycles of NAAC peer team visits and got accreditation with a rank 'B' (2.73) in the last cycle visit in 2016.

2.b. Present Status

Over the last couple of years, after the 2nd cycle accreditation, the college has made enormous progress in both academic-administrative and infrastructural sector and almost fulfilled the top ten recommendations of the peer team last time. The college, as per the suggestions, has taken bold initiatives for revamping the 'total image' of the college with new constructions, renovation, and extensions of the structure, and enriching the academic and scholastic area parameter. The college has introduced a variety of discipline specific add-on course and 3 months certificate courses parallely with the regular curricular transaction. The college has a standard strength of 2100 as of this academic session. The college is manned by 46 full time faculty and 21 employees.

The college has grown to a position to sensitive to gender variation, PWD, slow learner, friendliness to other category of student. The college has 8 ICT enabled classroom, 2 Nos smart classrooms, 4 Nos. computer labs, two hostels, courts of badminton, football and volley ball growth and sophisticated gymnasium, one canteen.

Nabajyoti College has signed series of MOU and Collaboration with different colleges, Universities and exchange and enhance research capabilities.

The college has/ is received/ receiving grants from UGC, RUSA and other agencies for research and development activities of the college. The college with all its infrastructure and human resources get fully prepared to implement NEP 2020 from this academic year and accordingly has taken up initiatives to introduce several new vocational courses befitting the diverse needs of the students.

A questionnaire in tune with current NAAC assessment accreditation framework has been prepared as shown in the Annexure-1. The metric are considered where academic department need to be involved. Weights for each metrics are fixed as per their importance for enhancing the quality of the College. As core in the scale of 0-4 is provided based on validation by the audit committee members on the claim made by the departments of the College. CGPA for every department has been evaluated using formula.

4. Observations:

a. Curricular Aspects

Nabajyoti College is affiliated to Gauhati University and accordingly follows the Curriculum set by the University. However, the college has been playing a significant role in Curriculum designing and framing Curriculum by offering valuable suggestions the university asks for in different times. Other than the University-syllabus, the college itself contributes a lot by preparing and designing the syllabus for various Add-on Certificate Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses on its own in compliance with the university guidelines and instructions. The college also conducts short term training in Vermi-Compost preparation and Civil Service Examinations. The students are exposed to various extramural and co-scholastic experience through series of out campus activities and programmes like field trips, visit to national parks, libraries, science laboratories, universities, film festivals and state assembly visit etc.

b. Teaching Learning Aspects

Nabajyoti College follows a transparent admission procedure in compliance with the government instructions and guidelines to ensure the enrolment of students from diverse groups of people in an inclusive manner. The average enrolment percentage for the assessment period is 100. The student-teacher ratio in average or the assessment period is 30: 1 Nabajyoti College adopts various methods of teaching to ensure experimental and participative learning such as group discussion, field study, class seminar, inter-departmental discussion, library visit, etc. The college employs ICT devices enabling library, e-learning resources for blended learning. The college utilises different online platforms for teaching and sharing learning experiences with the students digitally.

The faculty of the college are recruited as per UGC regulations and government guidelines and are encouraged to undertake various professional training i.e., Faculty Development Program, Orientation, Refreshers courses etc and they contribute their best for the excellence of the college. The college witnesses a large number of faculties with PhD degree, MPhil and other professional degrees during this assessment year totalling 10 PhD, 10 MPhil 02 BEd and 02 PGDCA.

The college adopts a continuous comprehensive evaluation approach for assessing students learning outcomes in addition to to the university examinations. The students' performance in examination and their achievement and failures are intimated with the parents by mailing the report card of their wards. A provision of awarding the best performer in examination with the "Award of



Excellence" at the end-semester of the course. Every department of the college works on the course and programme outcome beforehand and intimate the same with the stakeholders through orientation and career counselling programs.

To identify the strength and witness of teaching and other support facilities, a survey of student satisfaction in the form of SSS is conducted in the survey report analysed for further actions. The Grievance Redressal Cell of the college promptly attends to the grievances if any arising out of academic unfairness.

c. Research, Innovation and Extension

Nabajyoti College has built a research environment and has become a front-line institution in this area with a healthy ecosystem for innovation through institution's innovation council of the college. The innovation council of the college focuses on supporting entrepreneurship mechanism by way of organising motivational speeches by eminent entrepreneur experts and successful personalities to encourage students' involvement in entrepreneurial activities.

The faculties of the college used to engage in various research and innovative practices in scholastic and co-scholastic domain contributing towards the growth of scientific temperament in the college. The faculties are encouraged to excel in research and innovations by providing necessary fund and supported by the college authority. The department of physics, chemistry and botany have submitted proposals for projects on (a) Biomimetic Synthesis of Organic-Inorganic Hybrids based on Spider Silk and Hydroxyapatite, (b) Establishment of Woman Technology Park based on Agro-Biomass for Soci-Economic Upliftment of the Rural Woman in Kalgachia, (c) Establishment of an Integrated Aqua Culture Centre for the Socio-Economic Uplistment of the Rural People of Kalgachia and Optimise Pisciculture in the Area. The college has 10 No. of Phd, The faculty of the college have published more than 50 textbooks, 10 research papers in national/international/scopus/ UGC-care and peer-reviewed journals. The Research work done and proposed to be done mostly in area like orchid, medicinal plants and fish diversity and others. The college has a strong bond with the local community and is extends co-operation to the community during the time of needs. The college has adopted numbers of extension programmes and activities like "first-aid awareness programmes", health camps, cleanliness & plantation drive, literacy-awareness programme, Vermi-Composting etc which are appreciated by the local people.

The college has 02 collaboration for (on the job training, research and internship). Moreover, Facultity Exchange Programme between the Deptt of Physics, Nabajyoti College, Kalgachia and Bijni College, Bijni & BBK College, Nagaon.

d. Infrastructure

Basic infrastructure facilities for academic activities are available.

The Central library has good number of books which is also supplemented by departmental libraries. IT facilities are adequate. ICT enabled classrooms are inadequate

e. Students support and Progression

Nabajyoti College is committed towards student-support and progression and to keep this commitment, the college focuses primarily on building a conducive environment and ensures sufficient infrastructure and support facilities for an all round development of students. The college conducts mentor-mentee interaction as a routine-based activity.

The college provides necessary support system and services in terms of intimating information, career-guidance, financial facilities, academic counselling, scholastic and co-scholastic activities. There are cells for SC, ST, OBC and minority community for looking after the issues of



their welfare in respect of scholarship and other financial support and also conducting special classes for preparing these category students for competitive examinations. Other support services include redressal of student grievances cell, women cell and Internal Complaint Committee dealing with issues arising out of the respective cell concerned. Various activities for overall development of students including the soft-skill development, face to face counselling, health and hygiene, yoga and physical fitness are operational. A total of 864 students got the benefits of scholarship under various govt. schemes including minority scholarships during the last 5 years.

The college maintains a good relation with the alumni association of the college. The alumni association actively participates in various development activities of the college and contributes to the college in respect of infrastructure development and Academic Excellence.

Professional Development Activities

Nabajyoti College is governed by a full fledged governing body (GB) which acts as the apex body of institutional governance and the pioneer organization to ensure all inclusive growth of the college with a specific vision and dynamic policy initiative. The maxim in the college logo 'Learn-Labour and serve' motivates students to do their best. The college constitutes different cells and sub-committees for participatory management of the college. To ensure sustainable institutional growth, Nabajyoti College has taken up appropriate measures to implement e-governance in all area of operation. The college has taken up different short-term plans for implementation of NEP-2020 along with the long term plans for the institution. A perspective plan for a period of 10 years from 2020-2030 has been formulated by the college with approval of the governing body of the college on curriculum development, infrastructure, research, governance, students' progression etc.

The college facilitates professional growth of the employees by implementing the performance based appraisal system framed by DHE. The college has developed welfare schemes for students, teaching and non-teaching staff and hold programmes for faculty development and

progression.

The college develops strategy for mobilization and utilization of resources and funds from government and funding agencies and conducts financial audits on regular basis both internally and externally. The IQAC of the college monitors and reviews all the processes by holding meetings periodically.

Administration

- Efforts may be made to generate fund from Non Govt. sources
 including through philanthropy, individual endowment etc. besides
 approaching industries under CSR for specific, result oriented
 projects. To this effect, a policy on resource mobilization should be
 in place with statutory endorsements.
- The College should get accredited by NAAC at the earliest and also take part in NIRF ranking regularly. It should strive to avail fund under RUSA
- Non-teaching staff of the College need to be provided training on service related matters and student support
- Automation of all the services namely administration, finance and accounts, student admission and support should be completed
- Library automation including facilitating remote access should be initiated
